## April JOb Gu-wo-ni **Duck Killing Moon**



Mallard Duck - this native species of duck was an important food item for the Cherokees. They ate both the bird and its eggs. There are a number of families who bear the surname Duck, which is always derived from a male ancestor named Kawo-nu.

"Gu-wo-ni - April (Month of Duck Killing Moon) -in this month the Cherokees followed the migration of waterfowl to provide food for their families. In this month ducks and geese swarmed the waterways of the homeland and provided much food for the families. Those who are born under the Duck Killing Moon are great hunters, bringing in all that is needed for their family and enough to share with others."
