The program was a presentation by Dr. George Ann Gregory, a Fulbright Scholar/Fulbright American Indian Specialist titled "Holcaust of Native America, An Introduction".

The presentation covered the history of interactions between local and foreign populations. Dr. Gregory covered the Scandinavian, Spanish, English, and French impacts on local indigenous populations. It was
