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Gu-le Di-s-go-ni-hi "Mourning Dove: Gu-le Di-s-go-ni-hi. (literally: He cries for acorns). Also Yv-wi Di-s-go-mi-hi (he cries for human).

A popular source of food, the Mourning Dove was most often hunted with blow guns."



The bird is also known as the turtle dove, American mourning dove or the rain dove, and was

once known as the Carolina pigeon or Carolina Turtledove. It is one of the most abundant and widespread of all North American birds.
Its ability to sustain its population is due to its prolific breeding; in warm areas, one pair may raise up to six broods of two young each in a single year. The

young each in a single year. The wings make an unusual whistling sound upon take-off and landing, a form of sonation. The bird is a strong flier, capable of speeds up to 88 km/h (55 mph).
